

Elements of Art

<u>Line</u> – A path made by a moving point through space. It is one-dimensional and can vary in width, direction and length.

<u>Shape</u> – Shapes are flat, enclosed areas that are twodimensional (width and height). Artists use both geometric and organic shapes.

Form – Three-dimensional (length, width, height) and can be viewed from many angles. Forms have volume and take up space.

<u>Tone</u> – describes the lightness or darkness of a surface. To show form at least three different tones should be used; shadows, mid-tones and highlights.

Assessment Objectives

<u>AO1</u> – Develop ideas through investigations, demonstrating critical understanding of sources. For example artists, trips or other sources of inspiration.

AO2 – Refine work by exploring ideas, selecting and experimenting with appropriate media, materials, techniques and processes.

AO3 – Record ideas, observations and insights relevant to intentions as work progresses. E.g. observational drawings and annotations.
