Lumbini-Name of the place where the Buddha was born

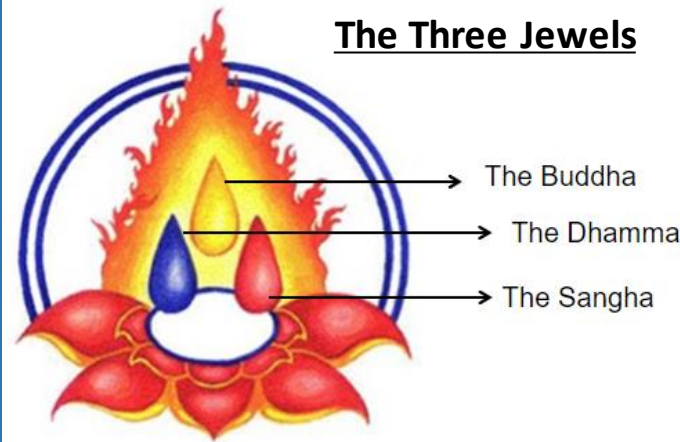
Dharma – The Buddha's teachings about truth

WORSHIP Buddhists can worship at shrines in their home or in temples. People will bring flowers and incense for the shrine and in the temples bring food for the monks. Buddhists take their shoes off in the temple and bow to the image of Buddha.



4 NOBLE TRUTHS

- 1) **Dukkah** – suffering exists
- 2) **Samudaya** – there is a cause for suffering
- 3) **Nirodha** – there is an end to suffering
- 4) **Magga** – in order to end suffering you must follow the eightfold path

Eightfold Path

Right Understanding – See things as they are and not how you think they are.

Right Thought – think about how you can be kind, a good friend.

Right Speech - do not say things to hurt others, be kind.

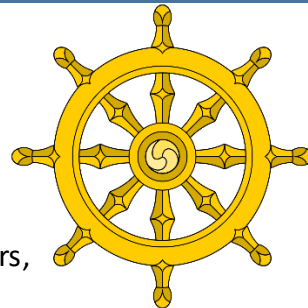
Right Action – Take care of life – don't destroy it.

Right Livelihood – earn a living (do jobs) without hurting others.

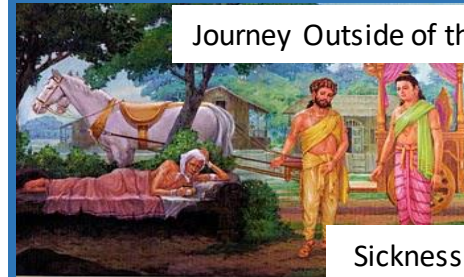
Right Effort – make the effort to do what is right.

Right Mindfulness – be aware of your actions, words and thoughts

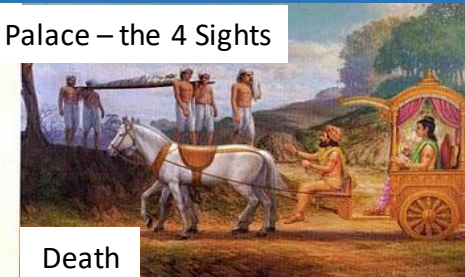
Right Concentration – learn to meditate without losing focus or concentration



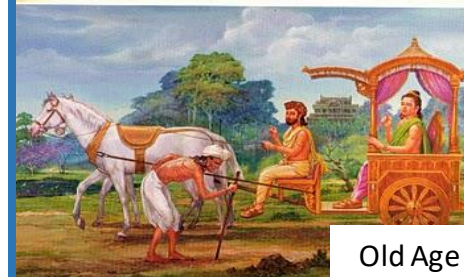
Journey Outside of the Palace – the 4 Sights



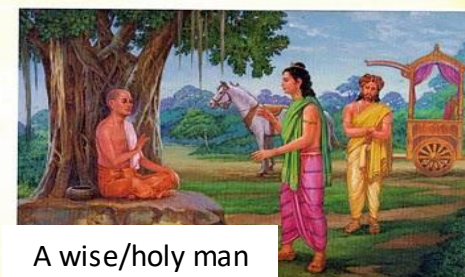
