Key Vocabulary



<u>Verbal Communication</u> – A way to communicate using language to convey meaning. It uses tone, volume, accent, emphasis and pace.

<u>Neutral</u> – A standing position that does not create any particular meaning to an audience.

<u>Mime</u> – Acting without words creating meaning for an audience.

<u>In role</u> – Sustaining a role during rehearsal or performance.

<u>Warm-up</u> – An exercise that an actor takes part in to ready themselves for rehearsal.

<u>Freeze Frame</u> – Using an actor's physicality to create a still image which conveys meaning.

<u>Performing in the Round</u> – Performing in a space where the audience surrounds the stage. Non-verbal Communication – A way to communicate without using language to convey meaning. It uses gestures, facial expressions, eye contact, no eye contact, body language and posture.

Rehearsal – The activity of creating, developing and practising a piece of drama to improve it and give the work focus

<u>Cliff Hanger Ending</u> – An 'ending' that happens before the drama has concluded its story.

<u>Character</u> – A person portrayed in a drama, novel or other.

<u>Vocal Choices</u> – How an actor uses their voice to convey character and meaning.

<u>Physical Choices</u> – How an actor uses their body language to convev character and meaning.

<u>Sustaining a Role</u> – Rehearsing And performing in role as the character they are portraying.
