Key Vocabulary



<u>Commedia dell'arte</u> – A style and genre of theatre that originated in northern Italy and relies on comedy stock characters with which the audience are familiar.

<u>Slap stick</u> – A style of humour involving exaggerated physical activity, which is greater than normal physical comedy.

<u>Exaggerated Physicality</u> – Over the top body language to convey character and meaning.

<u>Mime</u> – Acting without words creating meaning for an audience.

<u>Audience Awareness</u> – An awareness in rehearsal and performance of where the audience who are watching the performance are placed.

<u>Stock Characters</u> – Characters who are immediately recognisable and represent particular personality types or characteristics of human behaviour.

<u>Lazzo / Lazzi (plural)</u> – A comic routine demonstrating the characteristics of the character being performed.

<u>Comic Timing</u> – The delivery of physical and vocal skills to create comedy for an audience.

<u>Clear Physical Emotion</u> - Making a character's emotions clear to an audience through their physical skills.

<u>Status</u> – The importance or class of a character or group of characters compared to that of another character or group of characters.
