Lowest on the stave, lowest on the drum kit.

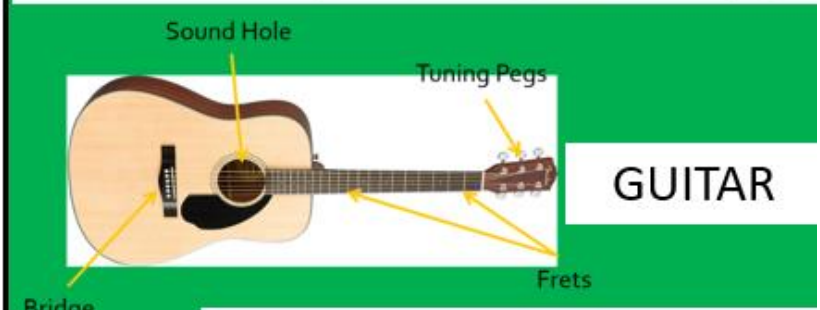
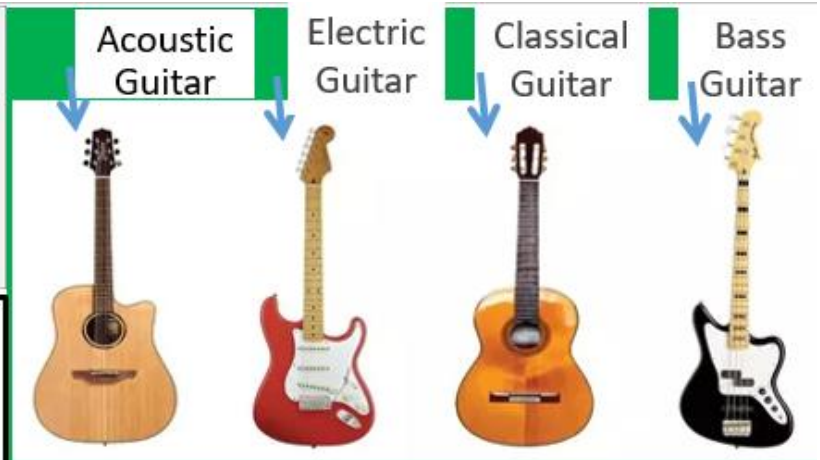
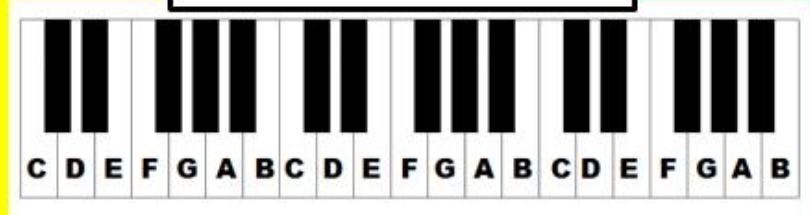
Snare

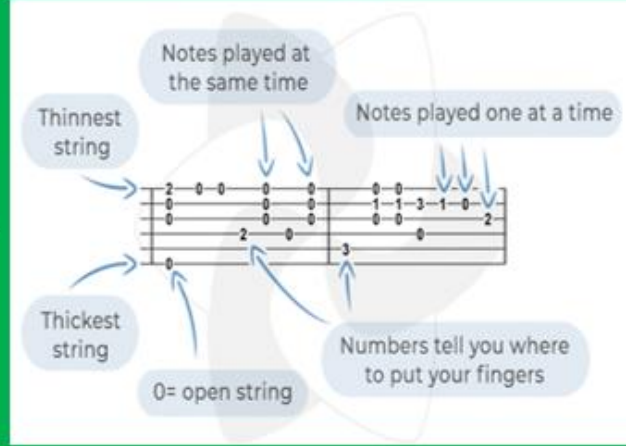


DRUM SKILLS

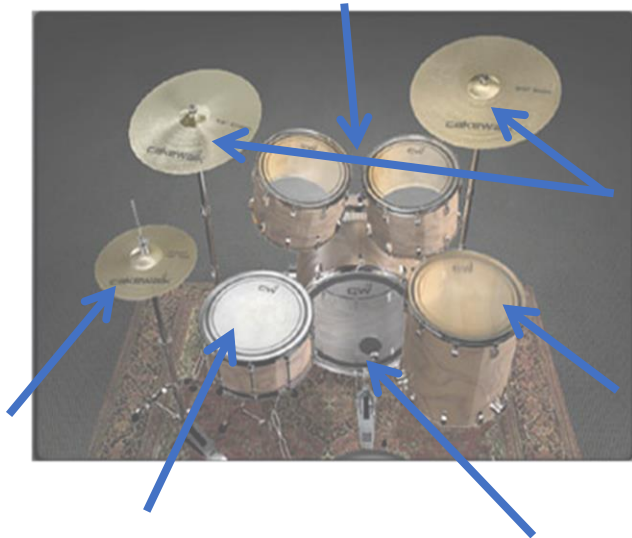
Tempo – How fast / slow
Dynamics – How loud / soft
Timbre – Types of sounds
Texture – How many instruments are playing
Fret – metal lines on the guitar
Tab – music notation for guitar
Drum fill – a short break from the groove that 'fills' in the gaps
Drum Groove – a repeated phrase that sets the tempo
Hook – a catchy part of the song.
Riff – a short and catchy melodic idea that repeats throughout the song.



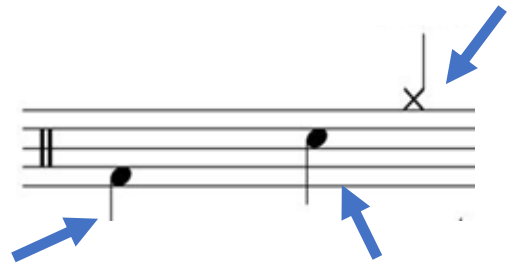

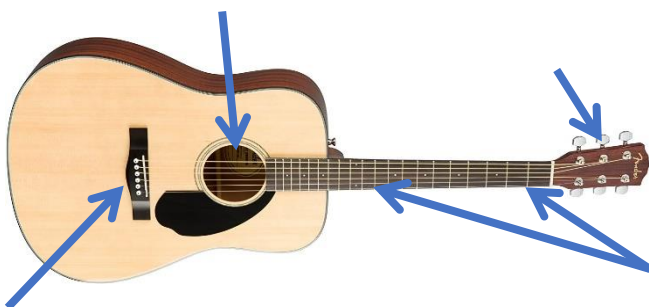

<p><u>Week 6</u> <u>Band Skills</u></p> <p>How to perform as a band?</p>	Asp: Perform simple parts. (Bass and Guitar one note, bottom line on keyboard, Basic drum groove throughout.)	
	End: Perform more difficult parts. (Bass and Guitar one note, top line on keyboard, Basic drum groove with cymbals, Vocals)	
	Acc: Perform difficult parts. (Guitar chords, both hands on keyboard, Drum Fills, Vocals)	
	Asp: Perform your individual parts mostly accurately. (You can make a few mistakes and only occasional stops / pauses throughout.)	
	End: Perform your individual parts accurately. (You can make a few mistakes and only occasional stops / pauses throughout.)	
	Acc: Perform your individual parts accurately. (You can make a few mistakes in the more difficult sections and with only occasional stops / pauses.)	
	Asp: Perform with some confidence.	
	End: Perform with some confidence. (know your part well)	
	Acc: Perform with confidence (eager to perform, know part, well-rehearsed, take a leading role in your group)	
	Asp: Perform, but song may not be finished or is short.	
	End: Perform a finished song.	
	Acc: Perform a finished song with a well organised structure and ending.	
	Asp: Basic overall standard of performance. (Parts will be accurate, but may not be in time with the band.)	
	End: Good overall standard of performance. (accurate parts, in time)	
Acc: Good overall standard of performance. (Making adjustments, stylistic performance thinking about Dynamics, Tempo, breathing and balance of instruments etc.)
