



- Quality of life The extent to which life is meaningful and pleasurable.
- Sanctity of life The belief that life is precious, or sacred. For many religious believers, only human life holds this special status.

Christianity and Islam Shared Beliefs - Sanctity of Life

- Life is a gift from God and only He can take it away.
- For humans to interfere is messing with God's Plan
- God knows when we will die
- Every Human and soul is created by God

Hospice - a place where people with terminal illnesses can go to die with dignity.

Palliative care - care that focuses on relieving pain and suffering rather than lifesaving.

X Forbid it in all circumstances -Sanctity of Life


X Foetus has a right to life

- **X** Not allowed for social reasons
- **X** Believe UK law is too liberally interpreted leading to too many abortions occurring




X Sanctity of Life Arguments

X Forbidden for economic reasons 'do not kill your child out of poverty'

X On the Day of Judgement the Child has the right to ask why – should not be taken lightly

X Some see it as haram (forbidden)

- ✓ Permitted if mother's: life in danger - seen as 'lesser of two evils'
- ✓ Permitted if child will be severely disabled
- ✓ Only permitted until 120 days, the point at which Muslims believe 'ensoulment' occurs









24 weeks - foetus is 'viable' can survive outside the womb

Muslim Funeral Rituals

Rites	Importance/Meaning
Shahadah whispered into the dying person's ears	Same words spoken at birth. Reinforces belief that in death Muslims return to their Creator
Cremation is forbidden	Body must be in tact for resurrection on Judgement Day
Funeral happens within 24 hours and	Ensures Muslims are clean ready to be before God




No gravestones – grave may be raised in a mound a mound bring them into the afterlife
