How do I read this?

Like any other text, graphic novels are read from left to right, top to bottom.



- Anthropomorphism** – when non-human entities (animals, objects) are given human characteristics
- Anti-Semitism** – prejudice and hostility towards Jews
- Auschwitz** – the most notorious concentration camp used during the Holocaust
- Concentration Camp** – a camp designed to imprison large numbers of people who are usually forced to work
- Death Camp** – a camp with the specific purpose to murder thousands of people
- Frame Narrative** – a story within a story
- Genocide** – the deliberate killing of a large number of people from a specific ethnic group
- Ghettos** – a sectioned-off part of a city for Jews
- Holocaust** – the genocide of European Jews during World War Two.
- Hitler** – Leader of the Nazi party and ruler of Germany from 1933-1945
- Jews** – an ethnoreligious group descended from the ancient Hebrews who follow the teachings of Judaism
- Kristallnacht** – the night of broken glass, a large-scale pogrom against Jews in Nazi Germany in 1938
- Nazis** – far-right political party with strong beliefs concerning racial purity who took control of Germany in 1933
- Pogrom** – a violent riot incited with the aim of expelling or massacring Jews.
- Propaganda** – information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or point of view
- Symbolism** – the use of symbols to represent ideas
- World War Two** – a devastating conflict fought between 1939-1945, instigated by the Nazis, facilitated the genocide of European Jews
