### Ramadan Mubarak

We want to extend the greeting of Ramadan Mubarak to all those who are participating in the month of Ramadan. Ramadan is a time of reflection and a way to empathise with those who are less fortunate than ourselves. Pupils will not eat or drink from dawn until dusk. To support our pupils who are fasting, we have made slight adaptations to the curriculum areas which are affected. Pupils will be required to participate in PE by changing into their PE kit and taking part where possible. In creative lessons such as music, staff are taking into consideration pupils needs and are adapting their teaching where possible. Where pupils are very strict observers, they will be permitted to spend the occasional lesson in our removal room to avoid invalidating their fast. We have also set up our library as a temporary prayer room which pupils can access during their respective KS lunch times. We will also keep this facility available after school too. While we support and encourage our pupils to express their religious beliefs, we are restricted with the facilities we have available to us but hope that you understand that we will always endeavour to do our best.
