School <u>uniform expectations</u>

When we return to school on Monday 15th April, we expect all students to return in full and correct uniform. Maintaining consistency in our expectation of how our students present themselves helps develop the sense of pride our students have in coming to our school.

Introducing The ARCH

As you will be aware, The Portsmouth Academy has an ongoing commitment to provide educational support and inclusivity for all. We have been working closely with New Horizons Primary School, which, as you may know, is part of the Thinking Schools Academy Trust, and many of our students come from the school. As such, we have worked with New Horizons to establish a dedicated area on-site to support a small number of students needing extra reintegration support as they transition back into the main school environment. This will open the first week of Term 5.

New Horizons has made careful adjustments to ensure that the introduction of this space does not interfere with the existing routines and comfort of their children or at Little Thinkers Nursery. Only 6 to 10 Portsmouth Academy students at a time will benefit from this provision, which will be located in a separate part of the school building in an area not currently in use. We will also be implementing staggered start times for these students to minimise any disruptions and maintain a stable and supportive learning environment for all.

This new space will not only aid with the reintegration of students back into school life and ensure they have the space to access specialist experts, but it will also strengthen our support for neighbouring schools and the Trust.
